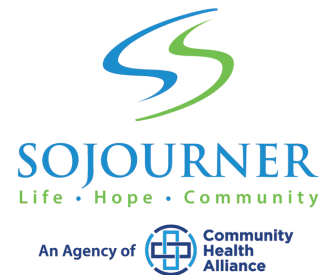

Social service systems can be complex and difficult to navigate. The Butler County Family and Children First Council (FCFC) strives to streamline and disseminate information about the available supports and services. From our free training for new workers and our resource cards & database, we hope to help grow your knowledge of our community's resources. Our council's mission is to serve as a catalyst for public and private partners to achieve the vision of improved well-being for families and children. We work with individuals, families, communities and systems to study data trends & gaps in services and bridge those with collaborations. Over the past year, we:

- Assisted 249 youth and families with complex needs to develop a team of support and organize the help that is needed to thrive utilizing high-fidelity Wraparound.

- Distributed over 58,000 resource cards and added posters and window cling options with QR codes.

- Hosted 26 training events for 1,520 individuals with 30+ partner agencies.

- Supported youth prevention efforts to disrupt the cycle of substance use and received a new \$3.9 million dollar grant from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to expand the work with council partners over the next 4 years.
